TREASURER'S REPORT 2013/2014

The 2013/14 season was solid from a financial perspective. There is a continued shortage of senior players that has led to a decline in senior subscriptions. The number of junior teams continues to be strong with a consistent level of subscriptions.

For the year ended 30 April 2014 the Club returned a net profit of \$ 15,377 consistent with prior year financial performance. Continued growth in junior subscriptions is becoming the cornerstone of the club, and a large amount of this has been reinvested into infrastructure within the Lane Cove area. As always, it's pleasing to see newcomers to the Club and the sport of cricket and the Club needs to ensure that a lot of time and effort is invested into the future of the Club being the junior teams. The Club has utilised its investment returns and retained surplus to invest in infrastructure projects off the back of the Kingsford Smith nets (\$40,000 in 2012/13) with additional commitments to the Lane Cove Council for the development of Practice Nets (\$50,000) and a commitment of \$10,000 to upgrade the facilities at Tantallon.

All together the Club has provided in excess of \$100,000 of funds to local council infrastructure for the benefit of cricket over the past two financial years. Consideration is also being given to the prospect of light at Tantallon and additional development of Kingsford Smith.

Despite a solid profit result, overall revenue has decreased approximately 10%. Costs have been managed well in 2014, with a 10% decrease in expenditure, mostly regarding clothing and merchandise to ensure that profit levels can be maintained. The revenue decline was mainly contributed by a reduction in senior subscriptions, as a result of "part time" players being utilised to fill teams, and a reduction of advertising. I note that a large amount of the advertising revenue lost in 2013/14 has already been replaced and will be of benefit in the 2014/15 financial year.

I would like to thank our sponsors and supporters for their support.

The Club continues to maintain its financial position and we are well positioned for growth. As a Club we have access to the best training and playing facilities in the community. I would like to thank all those involved from captains, junior representatives, coaches, players, parents and generally anyone who has continued to carry on the fine traditions of the Lane Cove Cricket Club.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the officers' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The officers have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1031 'Materiality', AASB 1048 'Interpretation of Standards' and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures', as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Sales revenue

Events, fundraising and raffles are recognised when received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Income tax

As the incorporated association is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

An asset is current when: it is expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within twelve months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is current when: it is expected to be settled in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are always classified as non-current.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

Trade and other receivables

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant and equipment (excluding land) over their expected useful lives as follows:

Buildings	40 years
Freehold improvements	15 years
Plant and equipment	3-7 years
Motor vehicles	5-7 years
Office equipment	3-5 years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Fair value measurement

When an asset or liability, financial or non-financial, is measured at fair value for recognition or disclosure purposes, the fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date; and assumes that the transaction will take place either: in the principle market; or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market.

Fair value is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming they act in their economic best interest. For non-financial assets, the fair value measurement is based on its highest and best use. Valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, are used, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

Fourth Grade Report:

Frank Gray Shield Report:

There were some very promising signs in what, on the whole, was a considerable improvement for Lane Cove's Frank Gray Shield Side. Despite managing only the one win across the 7-game season, we managed to compete strongly in 5 of the 7 games, and improvement was made in almost all areas from previous seasons.

Our season kicked off with a game against Mac Uni, after days of heavy rain, and we were greeted with a deck which would best be described as 'barely playable'. In light of this, the toss was going to be crucial, and it was not a favourable result for the Coves as we were sent in to bat. Missing a few players, we fought hard on the low and slow deck to scrap a defendable total together, led by Kiran Dindayal with 22. The conditions made it difficult to gain any momentum however, and we were bowled out in the 42nd over for 98. As the deck dried during the break, and batting became considerably easier, the task became more difficult. The side showed good discipline in bowling good areas, and staying up and about in the field, though in the end the result went against us.

Round 2 saw us host Roseville, a side we fancied our chances against, particularly with a couple more ins for the side. We were sent in to bat, and looked set to reach a good total at 3/52 before the all too familiar middle-order collapse saw us reeling at 9/78 before scrapping to 96. A second total of under 100 was frustrating, but we knew that with the bowling attack we had, it was not beyond defending. After a few quick wickets and tight bowling from Charlie Hipkin and Liam O'Hare in the middle of Roseville's innings, there was still a chance with two new batsmen in at 5/60. Some lucky batting unfortunately saw Roseville home however. Not the start to the season we had hoped for.

Round 3 saw us put together our strongest team of the season against Burwood, a side with several first and second graders, and one who had experienced a lot of success recently. A sharp and intense warm-up was an ominous sign, as we put together what was easily the best all-round performance from a Frank Gray side I have seen since playing at the club. Winning the toss on a good looking Tanty deck, Oliver Young and Sean Carnaffan strode out to the crease to start us off. The next 15 overs was simply awesome, as both Ols and Sean took Burwood's attack apart, smashing a 150 run opening stand, in what was just shy of a club record for an opening stand in Frank Gray. Both the openers easily passed half-centuries, with Ols falling only a few boundaries short of a century. The platform set by the openers was built on by the middle order batsmen, with discipline shown to ensure we stuck to the job, and batted out the 50 overs for a total of 246. The most complete batting performance I had seen, and one which we will hopefully be able to look back on as the benchmark in coming seasons. Despite our solid total, we knew Burwood had some very solid batsmen, and we recognised we would have to follow up the batting with a strong bowling and fielding performance to ensure we got the cookies. The fielding was sharp in the early overs, though no breakthrough to speak of. Charlie bowled well, and eventually got a breakthrough to set the ball rolling. In stepped Liam with one of the most dominant bowling spells I have seen in a long time. Within 3 overs, he had his 5-fa, bowling the perfect line and nipping the ball both ways off the deck. In the process he comprehensively bowled 3 Burwood batsmen, including their Captain and their best bat. With solid support from Alec Cornelius, who bowled extremely well throughout the season for us, Burwood had slumped to 8/57 and victory looked inevitable. A hard slog for the final two wickets, and some burglary from the Captain resulted in a 130-run bonus point win for the Coves, putting our season back on track, and giving us some momentum heading into the final round before the break.

South Sydney away was the next task for the young Coves. Souths, like us, had been steadily improving as a side over the last couple of years; however we felt we certainly had their measure

with the talent across our side. Sending Souths in on a typical lifeless Alan Davidson deck looked the right decision early as solid bowling efforts again from Cornelius, Charlie and Liam saw Souths struggling at 8/120 after almost 40 overs. Will Daly bowled superbly in the middle overs, completing his 10 overs at a frugal economy rate, and also picking up a couple of important wickets. One Souths batsmen was able to get on top of the bowlers, ending up with 82 as the final wicket to fall, however we had done well to contain the Souths to 156 all out. The reply started off very well, with Ols and Sean picking up where they left off the week before, sending the wayward Souths opening bowlers to all parts. On came the 'dangerous leggie'. Sending down some of the slowest arm balls I have seen, several of our batsmen managed to get themselves out in an embarrassing period of 10 or so overs that saw us slump to 8/90 odd. The Captain and Cornelius were left with the task of steadying the ship, and Cornelius showed significant discipline to bat within himself and tap the ball around for singles regularly. The partnership saw the Coves to within 8 runs of victory before Cornelius unfortunately fell after a very solid innings. In came Charlie Hipkin, who looked good from the outset. With two runs needed, Charlie feathered an edge to the Souths keeper, who took a sharp chance up at the stumps to give Souths the victory. It was a heartbreaking loss for the Coves, as we were in the box seat for the majority of the game, but fell just short in the end. The batting from our lower order however must be commended, as we got far closer than looked likely at 8/90.

Rounds 5 and 6 were tough for the Coves, with many players unavailable over the January period. Several younger players were asked to step up, and did so valiantly, however the tough opposition in Warringah and Georges River proved too strong. Special mention to Will Daly who was given captaincy duties against Warringah, and led strongly, scoring a tough half century to ensure the Coves set a respectable total.

A shaky middle order collapse, followed by a slight recovery from the lower order got us to a respectable, although slightly below par total. We bowled and fielded well, and fought hard to take the 10 wickets needed, but in the end, we didn't have enough runs to play with, and fell a few wickets short of taking out the win.

Despite the win-loss record, I saw substantial improvements from the boys, both individually, and as a team. Our bowling and fielding were particularly impressive, and gives us a solid platform to build from going into next season. A particular mention goes to Liam O'Hare, who was far and away the best of our bowlers, with some devastating spells throughout the season. He was supported well by Alec Cornelius and Charlie Hipkin, who both continue to improve as they get more experience. As is the story with most Covie teams, our batting continues to let us down, particularly during the middle overs, and is something we will need to improve on to compete come finals next season. Our two openers, Ols and Sean, were a shining light at the top of the order, and going forward we have the Burwood game as a perfect example for how good we can be as a side when everything clicks. Finally, Jarrod Rixon deserves a special mention as well, for taking the gloves for the entire season, and doing a consistent and reliable job.

I look forward to taking it to the next level next season.

Lane Cove Smith whilst maintaining its core of players from the 2012/13 season saw the departures of Adam McLean, Nick Radford and mid-way thru the season Josh Fish. New additions to the team were Harri Lee-Young, Nick Plazas and Will Hodgson who joined us from the North Sydney club.

Having won the Division 1 Championship in U11s and again in U12s, although in very different circumstances in those years, we were clearly the favourites and the team to beat in 2013. The challenge was always one of whether the size of some of the other teams would get the better of us with so many of our team being underage players. In fact only 3 players, Sean O'Farrell, Carson Forrest and Isaac Saunders were playing in their correct age group. 4 players (Mitchell Crayn, Adam Sidhu, Lachlan Phillips and Michael O'Farrell) were playing up 2 age groups.

The season started with a close win over last year's Minor Premiers, West Pymble Gold at Lofberg. Solid bowling by Adam Sidhu (3/11) and Carson Forrest (3/17) enabled us to keep West Pymble to 8/122 in their pursuit of our modest 5/132.

The toughness of this competition was to show up in the second match against Ryde Hunters Hill whom we defeated by 1 run. Having scored just 118 with Wil Hodgson (28no) and Sean O'Farrell (26) the only batsmen to get to double figures, we were under pressure immediately. Very tight bowling by Will Hodgson 3/8, Adam Sidhu 3/14 and Michael O'Farrell (4 overs 1/6) enabled us to bowl them out 2 runs short of victory.

A strong batting effort in our 3rd match against Lindfield Siddle enabled us to post 199, with Sean scoring 38no, Mitchell 35no and Adam 35. Lindfield were able to be contained to just 4/173 but all the games were proving tight.

Our 4th match was no exception. With our batting misfiring and only Lachlan Phillips and Harri Lee-Young putting on runs we limped to a modest 9/128. Again a strong bowling and fielding effort enabled us to bowl them out for 127.

4 games, 4 wins, 2 by 1 run!

The 5th game was a 7 run win over Lane Cove Clarke with Will Tobin (32no) and Sean O'Farrell (27) scoring the runs. Carson's 5 overs 3/17 did the damage with the ball.

Round 6 saw us in a 2 day game against St Pius at Forestville. Batting first we were struggling at 9/126 off 28 overs before Sean O'Farrell and Lachlan Phillips united to put on 65 for the last wicket and enable us to bat out most of our overs. We were able to put St Pius in and have them 3 wickets down at the end of day 1. Day 2 we bowled them out for just 67 and went for the outright but good defensive batting saw them hold us out at 5/57.

Round 7 we played Roseville at Gladesville and for the 7th time we batted first. We put on a reasonable total at 7/139 with Adam Sidhu (36no) and Will Hodgson (27) the key contributors. In what turned out to be a very close affair Roseville defeated Lane Cove by 2 wickets with 2 balls to spare. Our first loss and a close one.

Round 8 was washed out and Round 9 we played St Ives Haddin, one of the top sides. We again posted a modest total of 5/135 at Burns Bay but narrowly lost by 2 wickets. The 6 wickets we took for 4 runs certainly applied the screws and showed we would not give up without a fight but we just didn't quite have the runs.

Our last game before Xmas was a 20:20 against West Pymble and again we batted first – a common theme! In a welcome return to some batting form we racked up an impressive 7/161 with most batsmen scoring runs off the 5 over maximum overs. Mitchell's 30 was the highlight.

In our first match after the long Xmas break we defeated Ryde Hunters Hill, running down their total of 109 in 28 overs. The next match was a 2 day game against Lindfield Siddle and we recorded the highest score for a Junior Lane Cove team on record at 8/383 off our 60 overs. The standout innings was Hamish Cressey's 73 off 49 balls with the last 43 coming off only 18 balls. Adam Sidhu, Harri Lee-Young, Carson Forrest and Nick Plazas all scored into the 30s and our last 3 batsmen scored 118 runs. It was a tremendous effort and by far our best of the season. Day 2 we were hoping for an outright but against a resolute Lindfield side we were fortunate to bowl them out for 134 in the 50th over.

We went into the last competition round against Lindfield Davis needing a win to secure outright first place. It was not to be. Again we batted first and ran up 7/162 with only Adam Sidhu (37no),

Harri Lee Young (28no), Will Hodgson (23no) scoring runs. While we again applied pressure with the ball, especially towards the end to have them at 9/163, they won with 3 overs to spare.

While we lost our last match, so too did West Pymble and as a result we finished the season as outright minor premiers. An outstanding result in what was a very competitive division where in the last round the top 2 teams were defeated by the 7th and 9th placed sides.

The first weekend of the finals was washed out and so as the No 1 side we went straight through to the Grand Final against the No 2 West Pymble side. It was a worthy Championship match with the top 2 sides featuring. We won the toss and batted again – amazingly we had batted first in 12/13 matches we played this season!!

We started well with Mitchell Crayn and Adam Sidhu getting us off to a good strong start before we lost Mitchell to a run out for 20 when we were on 60. Sean got a life early and then shortly after Adam retired for a well earned 35no bringing Harri to the crease. Sean and Harri steadily accumulated runs with a partnership of 68 off 73 balls, before Sean decided to retire himself (who does that?!) on 26no. Hamish Cressey scored a quickfire 15 off 12 balls and Harri retired on 36no. Lachlan's 14 off 10 helped us close our innings at 3/180.

We applied early pressure in the field but were never able to quite close them out and by drinks they were slightly ahead of us. A fielding error where we had 12 players on the field saw us penalized 14 runs which brought West Pymble well back into the game. With 8 overs to go they needed 51 runs off 48 balls. A tense finale was ensured. Fortunately in what would be the championship overs (26 thru 29) Adam and Carson bowled 4 overs for 4 runs and took 3 wickets. There was no looking back from there and we went on to close out the game convincingly.

A huge congratulations to Steve Crayn who has now coached these boys for the past 4 years and to 3 Division 1 championships in a row. Its Steve's last season as coach and he goes out on top. Thank you also to Andrew Tobin who scored for us throughout the season. Thanks also to Colin Hodgson, Glen Phillips, Pierre Plazas and Chris Saunders who umpired for us during the season.

Another very strong season from our boys, many of whom have been together for four seasons now. We certainly played some very good cricket and on our day were (I believe) the strongest side in the competition. The eventual premiers, Gordon, would probably beg to differ but both times we played them we should have won, losing in the last over the first time when we had 10 men and mucking up a relatively easy run chase the second. On both occasions we were without our Shore contingent so unfortunately we didn't get the opportunity to face them at full strength. In any case it should have been a worthy final, however we lost a few games we should have won in the first part of the season meaning we were chasing points at the end, we finished a credible 3rd but due to our place on the ladder lost the semi on washout to a Mosman side we had beaten easily only two games previously.

In the main the boys played good hard competitive cricket, this year we moved further towards more defined roles for each player (batsman, bowler, keeper, all rounder), in the main the boys (and the parents) handled this pretty well. I'd be the first to acknowledge that this: a) can be a challenge for all; and b) is very subjective. I thought the boys did a very good job of running themselves in the field, many opposing umpires and coaches commented positively to me on on this. Very quickly from the start of the season practically all of the on field decisions were being made by the boys, so in this regard I feel they progressed significantly. So much so that many of the messages I sent out proffering advice were politely (on occasion) disregarded...which is clearly a good thing! In terms of individual improvement, I'm not sure it was a great year for that, as almost everyone has had better individual seasons. That said, I do believe that each of the boys has made further progress as developing cricketers. The private schools played havoc with our team sheets each week and several boys, who played Saturday morning games for school, really struggled with tiredness (quite understandably) by the time the afternoon game came around.

The awards:

Our Batting Award went to Max who scored 237 runs at an average of 47.4 in 12 innings, 7 not outs and a highest score of 42*. Though not an exceptional season, Max had a very consistent one, only once falling for less than 10. Other notable performers with the bat were Hugo (196 @ 28 in 10 innings, HS 33*), solid but not as dominant as last year, and Bas (181 @ 25.9 in 13 innings, HS 30*) who opened the innings well. Harry may well have won the award had he been able to play more games (175 @ 58.5, HS 36*), Will Robinson (145 @ 48.3, HS 42*) the same. Sam, who joined us from the UK in January, showed his talent and quality and with a few more matches would have been challenging for this award too. Nick, Cameron and Jack all made valuable runs during the season. Though no one had a dominant season with the bat as in years past, it was pleasing to see that every player made a significant score at some stage during the season.

Our Bowling Award went to Bas whose leg spin bowling delivered 19 wickets @ 10.32 with a best bowling of 4/9. Bas bowled consistently well all season and reaped the benefits of attacking bowling inducing many a false shot and stumping as the batsmen failed to deal with the ball flighted above their eye line. Bas won the NSJCA award for the best bowler (strike rate) in our competition. Other notable contributors with the ball were Hugo (10 wickets @ 10.60, BB 3/26), including a few match winning spells and Jack's craftily flighted offies (10 wickets @ 10.80, BB 3/5). Others like Flynn, Cameron, Nick and Richard bowled consistently well without always getting the wickets.

Our Fielding Award was won by Nick after taking 7 catches and effecting 2 run outs. Nick is a natural athlete with a great pair of hands and a strong arm who has been a consistent performer in the field for many years. Max had a good season behind the stumps taking 8 catches, effecting 8 stumpings and 5 run outs, he won the NSJCA award for the best keeper in our competition. Special mention must go to Will Bremner who managed to take an amazing 8 catches in the 3 matches he played for us. Hugo, Sam, Cameron and Harry all fielded consistently well, taking their catches and making their saves. As a team, the fielding this year veered between exceptional and very poor, as always an area in which more improvement can be made.

Our Most Improved Award was a difficult one, as a few players put their hands up, but in the end it was Joe Carter whose bowling and batting improved significantly through out the year, culminating a wonderful 38* against St Pius Red late last year. Joe's broken foot was great loss for the team and we know how disappointed he was. It was a great credit to him that he continued to come to the games and even the occasional training (on crutches) to support the team.
