PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2007/2008

It is with great pleasure that I write this report of our cricket season 2007/08. The Lane Cove Cricket Club has enjoyed a competitive and successful season both on and off the field in both our junior and senior areas of cricket.

Firstly the club fielded a total of 17 junior teams (up from 13 last season) as well as our JTS (junior training squad), which had approximately 25 beginners each Saturday morning at Kingsford-Smith Oval. Hopefully the club can successfully manage these (potential) cricketers and administrators over the next few seasons and give all those who love the game the right pathways to follow and become senior cricketers for Lane Cove, grade clubs and hopefully even further honours! Many thanks go to all the parents who assisted during the year, giving the potential Bradmans/Pontings a chance, especially the coaches/managers/umpires and scorers every week.

The senior club fielded a total of 8 teams across 3 competitions, with 1st – 4th grade and U24s in the Shires competition, 5th grade in the Tim Creer Cup competition and 2 Masters (over 40yo) teams. Congratulations to our 2nd and 4th grade teams who both played in the grand final, only to come up with 2nd place in both close matches! After such a successful season last season, where Lane Cove achieved our highest ranking (3rd) since 1969-70 in the Club Championship, there was a lot of negativity in the club as most of our previous season's 1st grade players had departed and many wondered how we would be able to compete. Due to strong leadership from the captain's and chairman of selectors (Stu Myers) the club was able to consolidate initially, and then prosper as teams bonded, eventually finishing 9th in the Club Championship. My thanks to all the captains for their efforts during the year in achieving these results, as well as maintaining Lane Cove's reputation as a tough but fair club on the field. This was highlighted by Lane Cove taking out the Spirit of Cricket Award in the Shires competition, an award voted on by your opponents as to how you conduct yourself across all grades! Our club continually raises our standards (and hopefully that of the competition!) and our committee were extremely proud to win this award, and that all involved in the club (players and captain's) took our message on board. Our 5s performed well in the Tim Creer Cup competition (under Trent Willoughby's stout leadership) but seemingly always found a star player in the opposition to destroy us, the young guns certainly enjoyed themselves this year though, as did our new group of Frank Gray players (Under 24's) led by new captain Alex Dodds.

Many thanks must go to the committee this season that have given the club the chance to achieve these results.

The Lane Cove Council must be thanked for their continued improvement of the on field facilities. Brian Dempsey, John Korol and Steve Donaldson provided excellent cricket wickets at Tantallon and Kingsford-Smith. John actually took out the prize for best ground in the Ground of the Year rankings at Tantallon, and Steve continued his great work at Kingsford-Smith. The quality of our playing surfaces no doubt had a huge bearing on our overall success this season and I do thank all those involved for their efforts here.

Our club has been privileged over the past 4 seasons to have been sponsored by Holgates Real Estate in Lane Cove, my thanks to David and Tim Holgate, who have always been willing to help.

The club has also received a great deal of help from Proactive Graphics who have kindly printed this report for us. Many thanks to Michael Sherman and his team for their help.

The club also successfully negotiated our 2nd season of sponsorship at the Longueville Sporting Club, where many post match discussions were held well into the night. All are welcome there to come and see our players, wives, girlfriends post match. Thanks to Andrew and the staff for all their help there. Also, my thanks must go to Kevin McBride and the board for their great support of sport in the area in providing such a family friendly environment for all our cricketers to enjoy, regardless of their age groups.

Finally, the club held a fund raising night at the Roseville Golf Club on the 17th May to raise money for the improvement of cricket facilities in our area. Special guests were the Mayor Ian Longbottom, and our Patron the Member for Lane Cove Anthony Roberts, as well as our guest speaker, Doug Walters. The club raised almost \$6000.00 and will use that money for junior and senior cricket. Thank you to everyone who contributed and a special well done to all those (Jo Balmer, Mick Stone, Brendan Hood, Michelle Bracken and Gerard Boyle) who organized a very successful night.

SEASON 2007/08
SENIOR CLUB REPORTS

First Grade Report:

Season 2007/08 was always going to be a rebuilding year for Lane Cove First Grade. From the team that was eliminated in the semi-finals the previous season, only 4 players, (Phil Brett, Iain Davidson, Cam McKay and Brett Richardson) would be in the team for the Round 1 clash against Pennant Hills.

9 players made their first grade debut for the club this season and we ended up using 20 players in total. Whilst the core make-up of our team was quite consistent throughout the season, regular occurrences of players becoming unavailable meant that we never fielded the same 11 players 2 weeks in a row. I would say that this was a contributing factor to some of our results.

We ended up finishing in 9th place with 3 wins, 3 draws and 7 losses. Of those 7 losses we lost to Georges River by 15 runs, Burwood by 1 run, Epping and Strathfield by 1 wicket and Macquarie Uni by 2 wickets in the final over of a one day match. If we had managed to win 2 of those 5 close losses then we would have been in the finals.

Having said that there were many positives to take away from the summer. We picked up 4 new recruits in the off-season who all played a large role in first grade this year. Joe Camarsh, Gerald Cornelius, Peter Cross and Angus Knapp all fitted into the team environment extremely well and contributed at different stages throughout the year.

Without a doubt our form player of the year was Peter Cross. He opened the batting and amassed 633 runs from 13 innings at an average of 48.69 with five 50's and 1 blistering century. He led the way all year with his dominant stroke play and aggressive tactics which had us in match winning positions more often than not. Unfortunately, he lacked support from the top / middle order at crucial times, highlighted by the fact that nobody else in the team averaged over 20 and the next highest run aggregate for the year was 224 scored by Iain Davidson. Davo did show some really good signs with the bat in the last half of the year. His innings in particular against Burwood where he nearly won the game for us showed tremendous maturity and knowledge of his own game and ability. I think Davo is in for a big year with the bat next summer. Everyone else showed glimpses with the bat without ever going on with it.

Despite the heroics of Crossy, it was definitely our bowling and fielding that thrived throughout the season. In fact our bowling average of taking a wicket every 18 runs was the 4th best in the competition. Simon Rowe who finished season 2006/07 in third grade as a batting all-rounder, finished this season as our 1st grade opening bowler. Rowey really stepped-up with the ball this year and filled a gap that I wasn't expecting him to fill. His ability to bowl consistent lines at a good pace meant I was confident every time I threw the ball to him. He finished the season with 23 wickets at 15.52 and an excellent economy rate of 2.61.

All of our other bowlers did fantastic jobs throughout the year. Camarsh bowling his leg-spinners, whilst only taking 14 wickets for the year, posed problems for many batsman and with some constant cricket (that this year's weather didn't always allow) I'm sure he will take some big bags in Shires cricket. Pete Mallyon was as cagey as ever bowling his left arm swingers and took 11 wickets. Alex Dodds played 5 first grade matches this year and looked better on each outing. He was the only bowler to take a five-for in the season and contributed some handy knocks with bat down the order.

Another player that developed well this year was our wicket-keeper John 'Wesley' Harpham. Like Rowey, Wes was picked from 3rd grade to make his first grade debut this season and got better and better with each match. It wasn't only his general glove work that improved but his attitude and presence on the field grew as he gained confidence throughout the season. His batting also was pretty handy scoring 116 runs at 16.57. If he keeps working on his batting he could prove to be a very good first grade cricketer for Lane Cove.

Apart from the individual performances the highlight for me in my first season as captain (since I led the Gordon Under 16's to premiership glory in the summer of 96/97) was the way the team gelled together on and off the field. After a bit of a shaky start early, everyone really seemed to enjoy each other's company and for a team that had never played together before, to see everyone desperate to win for each other by the end of the season was extremely pleasing ... the team reaction after we beat Auburn in the last round of the year is testimony to that.

We definitely have the ingredients of a team to mix-it in the semi-finals next season. A lot of guys now know what is required to succeed in first grade and I'm confident we will.

In finishing I just like to say a few thankyou's. Firstly to John Lloyd and his committee, thanks for your support in my first season as captain, it was much appreciated. To Gerard Boyle who got through mountains of work this year and was always the first to offer me words of encouragement or commiseration. To Stu Myers and the other captains for making those selections meetings so memorable, to Rowey and Club Dub for your assistance with the covers and to all the boys who played first grade this season ... it was an absolute pleasure !

- The sight of James 'The Shark' Clarke with his dark glasses and professional chip set. Still didn't do him any good as he lost his shirt along with Stipey losing his pants...but I hear that's nothing new.

- A great bunch of blokes at Warringah and having George as the officiating umpire is always a delight although he mixed me and Porky up when asking how my father enjoyed the Cricket Umpires luncheon at the test.

Round 9 vs. Strathfield

Third Grade Report:

Seldom have we seen such a frustrating year as the one third grade endured this season. Third grade suffered the paroxysm of being the most washed out side in the entire competition with 6 matches abandoned due to wet weather, including 4 matches in a row from round 5, and another 2 affected by rain.

In saying this every other team in our competition also had to play in inclement conditions, so we can't excuse the fact we only won two games this season.

We started off the year quite well, with a loss to eventual Grand Finalists Pennant Hills in round 1 after being in the box seat having them 5/94 chasing 208, but we took our foot off the pedal, and they beat us comfortably. Round 2 had us on track again with an excellent win against Georges River, highlighted by Mike "Rabs" Warren's superb 124, and important digs by Alex Dodds and Paddy Tompsett enabling us to enforce the follow on.

The next 6 weeks were affected by rain, with only one result possible in the round 4 match against Mac Uni, where the wheels well and truly fell off. Some highlights to come out of these abandoned matches, when play was possible, included Suren Reddy's better than run a ball 66 and Paul Ritchie's smashing 40 against eventual premiers Warringah.

The next match against Strathfield showed what we could be capable of if we believed in ourselves, and held our catches. We were totally outplayed on day 1, and were asked to chase a mammoth 317 to win. In a fantastic team performance with the bat, we fell 23 runs short with just about everyone contributing. Rabs and Suren both scored excellent 50s while some intelligent batting and big hitting down the order got us very close. Unfortunately we let them get too much of a score on day one; however the batting showed what we could achieve if we applied ourselves.

A washout against Roseville followed that, and we were left with only pride to play for. Against Semi-finalists NWS Hurricanes we consolidated to post a competitive total, and then came out guns blazing with the ball. Louis Gray's 1st spell of 5/17 on day 1 was tremendous, and he and Chris Camarsh should have gotten us the points with their fantastic spells. Unfortunately our catching lost us this match with no less than 6 elementary chances going down and they passed us 9 down. Louis finished with season best figures of 6/49 off 22, whilst Marshy was his usual miserly self in taking 3/35 off 27.

It turned out to be the battle for the spoon in the next match against South Sydney, in which I had 8 players the night before the match, and only 10 on the Saturday morning. With nothing but fun on our minds both sides went out looking to score quick runs, which resulted in us claiming a narrow 1st innings win on day one, with Sneaky Pete helping out on day 1. I bowled him 21 overs straight. He did the job though finishing with 5/40. The plan was to go for the outright on week two and on the back of Pottsy's thundering 50 we set the 8 man Souths side 140 to win. We got the 7 required wickets and a 29 run outright win, to lift us off the cellar.

So whilst we didn't finish anywhere near where I expected pre-season, there were certainly some encouraging things we can take out of the year. The emergence of excellent young cricketers coming through the ranks, and some experienced cricketers performing were certainly encouraging. We had 41 players this year, so I won't name you all, but I want to make mention of the following:

Suren Reddy was fantastic for us at the top of the order when he was not playing 2nd grade, and finished the year with 180 runs at an average of 36.00. Suren scored 3 fifties in his 6 innings in third grade and was our best regular batsman. Suren wins the 3rd grade batting award for this season. I expect to see Suren as a regular 2nd grader at least next season.

Rabs Warren is the other batsman who could have claimed the award, but he only batted 3 times for us meaning he is ineligible. Rabs scored 187 runs at 62.33 including the previously mentioned 124. He scored 1 hundred and 1 fifty in his 3 digs. Rabs was rewarded for his exceptional batting by making his 1st grade debut, where he batted well. We can expect to see more of Rabs in 1st grade in the coming seasons.

Andy Harley played his maiden season for the Coves, and started it with a tremendous century in 4th grade. He spent the rest of the year with us in 3s and whilst he didn't reach the heights of that century he played some important digs. Andy put his hand up to keep wicket for us later in the year and was very good. Some more training and experience in that role will see Andy develop further with the gloves, which is a fantastic acquisition for the club. His enthusiasm on and off the field made life very easy for the skipper, and I would like to thank Andy for all his help with everything I ever asked. He's a great pick up for the club and I look forward to watching his development as the years go on.

Geof Sundstrom joined us just before Christmas, and was a valuable ally on the field to bounce ideas off. Geof was also a very valuable help to me off the field and was always first to help with covers, or to have a chat about things. Thanks again mate. I look forward to never having to need worry about you batting 11 again.

Jamie and Bryan Dempsey came to the club mid-season and are two people we should feel excited about having with us. Bryan is the experienced top order batsman with a leader's brain and was also a very valuable player for me to bounce ideas off. His batting will be very valuable for us in years to come, as will his leadership. Jamie is a promising wrist spin bowler, but it is his batting that shone for us this year. Given more of a chance in the top order in coming years I expect Jamie to score lots of runs for the club.

Paddy Tompsett started the year as an opening bowler and indeed finished as our leading wicket taker, albeit with only 11 wickets at a good average of 18. It was also with the bat he showed what he is capable of averaging 24. Paddy showed plenty of potential with both bat and ball, and I look forward to reminding his brother Ben how much more talented the younger Tompsett is.

Paul Ritchie showed this year that he will be more than a handy all rounder for the Club. Ritch played some devastating digs with the stick, and bowled with good heat and control as a new ball bowler. Ritch should be one of the 1st picked for next year's Frank Gray side, and should expect to play in the top two grades in the coming years.

I would like to thank all those who played 3rd grade this year, some such as Ed Petrie, Murray Holmes and Michael Chase as desperate ring-ins at the 11th hour. It was a difficult year, but one that was thoroughly enjoyable in reflection. We finished 1st in the Spirit of Cricket award for the entire 5 grade shires competition. That is something we can take a lot of pride in.

I would like to thank everyone I have had the pleasure of captaining over the past two seasons for everything they have done for me to make skippering a side for Lane Cove such an honour.

To the selection committee thank you for your support. Even when some of the meetings got emotional, we were able to nut things out and I think the right decisions were almost always made. Congratulations to 2nd and 4th grade for playing in their respective Grand Finals. I take a lot of pride that members of both sides contributed to 3rd grade this year. And as always to Lloyd, for being the best administrator in the game, or certainly better than some, thanks for everything mate.

Fourth Grade Report:
