PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2023/2024

The club's performance for 2023-24 was essentially one of treading water, particularly in relation to club administration, but so too with on field performances. The highlight was 1st grade's performance, finishing the regular season 5th, but disappointingly eliminated in the qualifying final. In the Juniors, we fielded 29 teams, winning one premiership.

On the administration side, a big thank you to club Secretary Taylor Cotte-Warner, club Treasurer of 13 years Paul Bakker, and Chairman of Selectors Andrew Bray, for keeping the club running. Also a special thank you to 5s captain Ash Singh for all the hard work running 5th grade.

With several changes to personnel on the club committee in 2024-25, better club administration is expected, hopefully manifesting in better on field club performances next season and beyond.

Council ground hire rates increased in 2023-24 due to increased demand and limited supply. LCCC are pushing back against these increases by keeping other sports accountable for their ground use. Nevertheless, ground hires rates are further increasing in 2024-25.

Results from the September 2024 Local Council election are expected soon and may impact the groundsman's access to work on KSO. Depending on who's elected, there could be incongruent work cover and council regulations in regard to dogs, resulting in the groundsman breaching work cover rules if they work on KSO. Overall, dogs and grounds are ongoing issues which need to be actively managed to ensure the club's on going access to grounds, and hence the club's viability.

The introduction of lights at the Blackman Park nets has been a major success, with heavy use over the off season. The club has paid \$17,000 for the lights to be on from April through to September. However it's expected to be a big attraction to players to stay with or join the club.

The SCA have implemented Code of Conduct changes and are expected to implement a crackdown on conduct at the start of the 2024-25 season. So be aware. The SCA has also mandated boundaries be 2.74 metres in from ground fences for 2024-25 onwards.

Pleasingly junior registrations for 2024-25 are up. Of note, under 9s are increasing from 5 teams in 2023-24 to 9 teams in 2024-25.

At this point, the club has not engaged a senior coach for 2024-25. Expected cost to do so is in the range of \$10k to \$12k. Players are welcome to provide their input, but should be aware that engaging a coach will likely increase player fees.

Finally, a big thank you to the committee, captains, team managers, Lane Cove Council, sponsors, and all the volunteers that keep the club running.

Wishing everyone an enjoyable and successful 2024-25 season.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2023/2024

The 2023/24 season was a strong season for the Lane Cove Cricket Club.

Whilst there had been challenges with growth in Senior players in the past, there was a noticeable increase in Senior subscriptions again. Junior members subscriptions have dropped off slightly from their height in previous years. There has been a solid growth of girls in cricket, which has been incredibly promising. While the number of senior and junior teams continues to be consistent, our financial security is dependent on maintaining this into future years.

For the year ended 30 April 2024 the Club returned a net profit of \$11,822 before some additional Grants from Cricket NSW of \$12,510, which resulted in total comprehensive income of \$24,332 for the year. I note that while operational expenses continue to rise over time, appropriate measures have resulted in maintaining an acceptable level of expenditure. However, continued focus into the future will be critical given impending and constant increases in Balls and Ground Hire.

Significant increases in Ground Hire and increased player registration and NSJCA registration fees continue to be the club's largest expense. There is a continued focus by the board to ensure that these can be managed appropriately going forward. It's important to note that any material increase in these could result in financial pressure on the club that may see a sustained increase of player subscriptions. Player fees are set based on the expected costs for the year and the number of expected player registrations, and can change from year to year.

Significant consideration will need to be given to the level of player subscriptions in 2024/25. Consideration will also need to be given to the ground hire costs which are expected to increase.

It's pleasing to see newcomers to the Club and the sport of Cricket, and the Club needs to ensure that a lot of time and effort is invested into the future of the Club, being the junior teams.

I would like to thank our sponsors and supporters for their continued support in the sport of cricket, and the Lane Cove Cricket Club. I would also like to acknowledge those members that have made donations to the club over the season.

The Club continues to maintain its financial position and we are well positioned for growth. As a Club, we have access to the best training and playing facilities in the broader Sydney community. I would like to thank all those involved from captains, junior representatives, coaches, players, parents and generally anyone who has continued to carry on the fine traditions of the Lane Cove Cricket Club.

Notes to the financial statements

Note 1. Significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the officers' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The officers have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1031 'Materiality', AASB 1048 'Interpretation of Standards' and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures', as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Sales revenue

Events, fundraising and raffles are recognised when received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received, and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Income tax

As the incorporated association is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is current when: it is expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within twelve months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is current when: it is expected to be settled in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are always classified as non-current.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash, and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

Trade and other receivables

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant and equipment (excluding land) over their expected useful lives as follows:

Buildings	40 years
Freehold improvements	15 years
Plant and equipment	3-7 years
Motor vehicles	5-7 years
Office equipment	3-5 years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Fair value measurement

When an asset or liability, financial or non-financial, is measured at fair value for recognition or disclosure purposes, the fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date; and assumes that the transaction will take place either: in the principle market; or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market.

Fair value is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming they act in their economic best interest. For non-financial assets, the fair value measurement is based on its highest and best use. Valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, are used, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

Independent auditor's report to the members of The Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc.

Report on the financial report

I have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc., which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2023, the statement of profit or loss for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the officers' assertion statement.

Officers' responsibility for the financial report

The officers of the Lane Cove Cricket Inc. are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report, and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Act and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The officers' responsibility also includes such internal control as the officers determine is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the officers, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In my opinion, the financial report gives a true and fair view of the financial position of the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc. as at 30 April 2024, and its financial performance for the year then ended.

Basis of accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc. to meet the requirements of the Act. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

SENIOR CLUB REPORTS

First Grade Report – 2023/24

Is had a change in leadership this season, going for the old 2 is better than 1 approach and appointing co-captains. This, and along with a couple of new Victorians who had seen the light and moved north, we went into the season full of hope and anticipation. This season introduced the new finals series for the one-day competition, which meant there was more silverware on the line, and we felt like we had the squad to chase it. Having been bundled out of finals for the last 4 seasons by being the lower placed team and having a game with no result, we were determined to change our luck come the business end of the season.

The campaign started at Penno for the second season running which was a chance for us to shake off the preseason rust. And boy there was some rust. An easy win on paper but it felt like anything but during the chase. A few (plenty) too many wides (33) in our bowling gave us a more sizeable run chase than we should have been looking at, but one we should have cruised to if we batted well. We got there 6 down but not without some wobbly legs and bitten fingernails due to a couple of untimely collapses that would not surprise any long-time followers of Lane Cove.

Round 2 saw us move back to our beloved two-day format, coming up against eventual one day premiers winners and the overall losing grand finalists (spoiler alert) Georges River. With a couple of our stalwart bowlers missing, it was a tough day 1 losing the toss and watching River bat all day. Their fatal mistake came before play on day 2 thinking they had enough runs and declaring. 76 overs later and we had chased it two down with Co-Captain (sole captain for the day) Mike Bryant scoring one of the more impressive not out tons (136* including six 6s), ably supported by our Irishman James Hunter with 112 not out of his own. A record breaking 250 run 3rd wicket partnership to get the chocolates. Incredible scenes.

Unfortunately, the highs bring the lows, and in what was a theme of our season, we then went on to bat horrendously and lose against Warringah, who if we played another 9 times, we would have won all of them. Bouncing back with a big win at Roseville we got our season back on track. Rain then ruined what would have been an interesting chase for us against Epping. With the game in the balance the heavens opened. But we still weren't back to our best cricket.

Coming up against Burwood, we were out for revenge from last season's finals series. Missing a few players, we had a tough day 1 bowling on a good batting deck. Day 2 came along with temperatures reaching a scorching 42 degrees. With other games being called off due to heat, amazingly we chased down 253 with Mike Bryant scoring 90 and Mitch Cross facing 150 balls for his 45 not out. A ridiculous effort given the temperatures and a great sign that we could tough out a win in difficult circumstances.

Keeping with the theme of the season, we came hurtling back down to earth next round being rolled for 86 against Strathfield. The yo-yo season continued with a great win at NWS followed by another shocking performance to lose to SDs. A big, tough win followed, this time at Auburn before our worst game of the season against Souths limping to 45 all out in our first innings.

The last game of our regular season was against archrivals Lindfield and boy was it entertaining. Having made 95 on a bowling friendly pitch and copping a lot of "suggestions" about how to bat, our bowlers stood up and rolled them for 48 with a few choice words of our

own. There was no love lost during the second innings as we pushed for an outright victory, but as conditions worsened, tensions rose. The umpires decided they had had enough in dramatic fashion, adding to the ordeal. However, with all things said and done, we finished the regular season in 5th and were up against Burwood in the finals for the umpteenth time.

Fearing turning up to a strip of concrete again, we were pleasantly surprised as the covers were peeled back at Rothwell to reveal a pitch with a bit of life in it. Our bowlers, superbly led by Ravi Ravi (6/28 off 21), and backed up in the field, went through Burwood for 104. With only their captain able to get over 10 it was an outstanding effort and set up the game nicely.

We knew we would have to bat well considering the opposition and we were cruising at 1/30 before 3 quick wickets had us reeling. A fight back in our middle order had us back in front but regular wickets kept Burwood in the hunt. Coming to the end of day 1, our co-captains were batting together for the 8th wicket partnership and looking solid, getting the runs needed down to 11 at stumps. Unfortunately, disaster struck in the first over of day 2, and we lost our 9th and 10th wickets the following over to fall just 8 runs short. With a lot of cricket left, we had hopes of an unlikely reverse result but as Burwood blocked and left their way through 73 overs, we shook hands.

A heartbreaking way to go out, made worse by Burwood cruising through their semi and grand finals to win the premiership at a canter after the trouble we had caused them. Looking back at our season, I certainly feel our best cricket was definitely top 2, and grand final worthy. During the season we spoke about trying to even out the highs and lows of our performances, but this is obviously easier said than done. Something to work on for next season as the bulk of our squad is coming back, we know we have the talent to be there holding the trophy at the end.

Thank you to everyone who made this season so special. To captain this club that I love in first grade is such a privilege for me and something I will be forever proud of. A special thanks must go to my co-skip Mike Bryant. It has been a pleasure to captain alongside you and to be able to bounce ideas off each other. I believe this really brings out the best in both us and the team. On that note, a big thanks to all of those who have played this season in 1s. We had a great campaign and created some memories I personally will have for a long time. Finally, those behind the scenes who make it all possible - Dave, Hoody, all the other captains and the rest of the committee, thank you for the work you put in that doesn't get the recognition it deserves. Hopefully next season will be another beauty with some bling at the end.

Second Grade Report – 2023/24

Season 2023/24 brought with it a number of changes and challenges for a squad that had previously made the semi-final or better in 4 of the last 5 seasons.

After several stoic years at the helm, Pete Blood finally relinquished the 2nd grade captaincy (this time, in earnest) and entered the world of 'ad hoc' player availability. Co-captain, Charlie also made the transition to a more casual position with Joe 'Dev' Camarsh and myself being anointed as the new leaders to direct the team moving forward.

While a mix of recent player retirements, promotions, and intermittent availability was certainly felt across the club, the impact of this on 2nd grade was the absence of a sizable core player group to carry momentum and/or manage setbacks throughout the season.

Nevertheless, we headed into Round 1 bright-eyed and bullish under a change in management. Losing the toss wasn't the best start, but the boys managed to make the most of being sent in to bat, exhausting the full 50 overs and posting one of our largest totals of the season (6/250). Penno bully, Pete Blood, kicked our innings off well with a solid 39, but it was Isaac Edmunds who really led the charge. Not only did Isaac post a well-measured 54*, but he forged two solid partnerships with, young-blood, Michael Ligoury (37) and the 'new skip' (41*).

The first outing for the bowlers was equally encouraging. Club stalwart, Charlie picked up the new season where he left off with 3/24. Contributions from Dev (2 poles), Carson (1), Angus (1), and Michael (1), were supported by two great run outs – An all round team performance to secure a comfortable win.

Despite the confidence gained, our second game of the season was the first to stress the squad's depth. Several unavailabilities across 1st and 2nd grade demanded that the remaining players step up to last years' fellow semi-finalist.

As a result of losing the toss (again), GR elected to bat and the boys put in a hard day's work in the field. After 81 overs, GR finally declared at 5/308. Although the fielding performance left much to be desired, both Carson (1/57) and Dev (1/88) put in admirable shifts with the ball, bowling 18 and 21 overs, respectively.

In response, the boys got off to a flyer with the bat. Both the first and second wicket partnerships were in excess of 50 runs, capped off with a magnificent century from co-skip, Dev, who finished on 109. When our sixth wicket partnership (65) between Zuhaib and Carson pushed the total passed 250, it was easy to see GR feeling the pressure. In one of the most steadfast performances of the year, we managed to push GR all the way. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be, and the lads fell 40-odd runs short, in what would have been a major upset (of the ultimate 2023/24 premiers). Cracking stuff.

Round 3 saw us back on the road, this time at Weldon Oval. Another toss lost made it 3/3. Nevertheless, the bowling unit was at full strength and firing. Chirag Patel produced a very measured spell of spin bowling, taking 3/27 and Charlie 3/36, with another cracking spell. 'New skip' managed to chip in with 2/18 and another run out completed a sound team performance, dismissing Warringah for 144.

The following batting performance was a master class in park cricket. An opening stand of 150 by Zeus (44) and Dev secured 1st innings points, with the latter raising the bat yet again, with another wonderful century (104). A combination of player unavailability and bad weather denied the opportunity to push for an outright victory in week 2.

Back at home, we hosted Roseville at Tantallon and successfully lost the toss once again. Unfortunately, significant wet weather in the days prior meant that every team batting first in Sydney was up against it. Accordingly, Roseville promptly sent us in. On a particularly difficult surface, we were only able to manage 124, but a truly wise innings from Zeus (63 from 147 rocks) was a positive on a hard day.

Conditions the following week were completely different. The previous week's moisture was replaced by something resembling the Simpson Desert. On a batting paradise, Ed Dodds (3/27) and Dev (2/24) did their best to defend our meagre total, with Doddsy plucking arguably the catch of the season with an absolute ripsnorter at square leg to dismiss the top run scorer. However, it wasn't enough. Roseville prevailed by 4 wickets.

Round 5 saw us facing up against Epping, who had given us several good battles over previous years, and this match would be no exception. Encouragingly, we finally managed to win the toss and elected to bat on a good-looking deck. While our first 4 wickets fell somewhat cheaply, Michael Ligoury (27) and Isaac Kensell (31) produced the counterpunch we needed. With wickets continuing to fall, Covie rookie of the year, Mitch Cross, came to the fore and posted a magnificent 63 (over multiple sessions). 'New skip' provided competent support at the other end (42), helping the boys get to a defendable 198.

While the bowlers were granted a good 10+ overs at the Epping openers, the week 2 weather quickly put an end to proceedings.

Once again, a lack of player availabilities was taking a toll. This time against the ever formidable, Burwood. After sourcing an eclectic mix of cricket talent, 'new skip' was also able to win the toss and sent the Briars in, sensing an advantage with the new ball. Round 6 saw the debut of Shaun Tait's 'brother from another mother', Vidu. The new club speedster stepped up with the new rock and promptly rattled the top order bats. At the other end, 'new skip' put down an elegant spell of swing bowling (2/14), but was completely gassed after 12 overs. Fortunately, Chirag (3/56) and Michael (3/48) had the talent to reign-in several experienced batsman, while making a statement on a new bowling strength.

Unfortunately, our batting chase lacked the same tenacity. The risk of an outright loss quickly became a potential reality, if not for the defiance of three seasoned operators, Rahul (29), Dev (28), and Zuhaib. While Zuhaib didn't apply significant scoreboard pressure, his ability to soak up a mountain of deliveries in extreme heat (42+) was Dravid-esque.

With a Christmas break on the horizon, the boys were able to promptly brush themselves off and recalibrate for one-day cricket. Another lost toss resulted in the boys bowling first, but it only took 2 deliveries for Carson (1/18) to take the first scalp. While Strathfield were able to counter attack, Wardy (1/32) produced a fine display of one-day bowling, on a particularly batter-friendly surface, and followed it up with a classic infield run out. Such efforts precipitated a steady flow of wickets, with contributions from Chirag (2/15), Greavesy (1/10), Vidu (1/22), and Harvey (1/22), to restrict the home side to 178.

Despite an early hiccup in reply (Zeus succumbing to head noise), the boys let rip with Dev posting another half century, dispatching deliveries to all parts (in and out) of the ground. Support provided by Rahul (31) put the Covies in the driver's seat. Two quick wickets weren't enough as finishers, Carson (39*) and 'new skip' (43*) quickly put Strathfield out of their misery. A highly satisfying team win and the perfect result heading into the mid-season break.

Our first game back from the Xmas break was a truly horrid one. I could list off all the excuses in the world; lack of availabilities, delayed onset NYE hangovers, or a playing surface akin to the 38th parallel of the Korean peninsula. Regardless, we produced a double figure total that was indefensible and well below the standard we hold ourselves to. A more than competent opening spell from Angus (2/22) was the only bright spark on a dark, dark, day.

Due to the commencement of remediation works at Tantallon Oval, our remaining home games were all moved to the local cricket share-house, KSO. Our following fixture against Mounties also saw the return of a number of regulars, bringing us back to a full-strength side. Determined to make amends for the previous weeks' performance, Zeus (79) led the batting, producing a complementary display of stroke making (incl. a couple of handy maximums). A commendable contribution from young Ollie Meichan (29 off 90 odd rocks) provided a sound platform to carry our total to 180.

With the rock in hand, Vidu put on arguably his best spell of bowling (2/20) of the season. Not only testing the batsman reflexes, but also exhibiting a disciplined line exactly when it was required. Once again, Chirag delivered a very mature performance (3/20) off his 10, and contributions from both skippers, Charlie and Angus, was enough to defend our total and get us back in the winner's column.

Unfortunately, our bowling effort in the next game wasn't nearly as sharp. Old rivals, Auburn, made us work for wickets and it wasn't until young wrist spinner, Michael 'Panda' Ligoury, that inroads could be made. After a few 'warm up' overs, Michael delivered a classy spell of 5/39 (10), limiting the Eagles to 264, when a much dearer total was potentially on the cards. Again, Zeus led the scoring with a staunch 45, aided by 'new skip' (43*), Michael (33), and Ollie Meichan (28). Unfortunately, we were unable to form the extra 1-2 partnership(s) required in the middle/lower order to get us over the line. A good fight, but an ill-disciplined bowling/fielding effort early on, left us chasing our tails the remainder of the day.

The return of serious wet weather resulted in the next clash being moved to a neutral venue (Epping). The decision to put in Balmain failed to generate the desired effect, with only Carson taking an early scalp. Subsequent wickets were much more difficult to come by, but a change from spin back to pace proved fruitful. A threatening spell from Angus ended up being the catalyst for a trickle of wickets at the other end, Carson picking off 4/22. Gus was later rewarded with 3/54. Meanwhile, Mr Consistent (Chirag) put in a massive effort to take 2/54 off 19.

For better or worse, our batting reply was prematurely halted by the commanding return of wet weather. The absence of a result was less than desirable and signalled a closing door to any finals cricket berth.

Our last fixture was against crosstown rivals, Lindfield, who were particularly eager for a favourable result to help their (uninspiring) finals run. More bad weather and protracted Tantallon works resulted in another fixture being played at a neutral ground. Complementary conditions assisted the bowling unit, but it was spin (once again) that proved to be the dagger to Lindfield's heart. Both Michael and Chirag produced quality spells, taking 4/27 and 3/33 respectively.

Chasing was off to a rocky start and particularly tense. The new 2nd grade night-watchman (Chirag) was deployed, providing appropriate resistance and body language in equal parts. Unfortunately, actual scoreboard pressure was limited to Zeus (28) and 'new skip' (25), leaving us agonisingly short by 12 runs.

So here end-eth the 2023/24 season (review). In many ways it was quite a typical cricket season, but ultimately one that could be defined as 'rebuilding'. While we were often short on numbers and lacked some consistency, there were several encouraging signs for next year. New bowling talent is here, especially with spin, and some older heads are still here to develop the right mix. In all, it's clear to me that a new core group is emerging, one that has every right to challenge for the premiership in years to come.

Third Grade Report – 2023/24

This season also marks my 9th and final season as a full-time Covie. In light of this I want to extend a special thanks to Hoody, Dave, Drew and the committee for running the club over the past few years in addition to the committees of earlier years. Without these volunteers who constantly stick their hand up and do the dirty work behind the scenes this club would simply cease to function. I also want to thank Arun who deputised for me throughout the season and leant his experience and advice throughout.
