PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2025/2026

Season 2025/2026 was a very challenging season for the club. Unfortunately, the senior club was advised in July 2025 that we needed to pay for umpires for the first time in the competition's history. This basically meant that our grant from Cricket NSW had to be used to cover these costs.

Whilst keeping our fees as low as possible, the club successfully, with the help of some very diligent committee members implemented a policy regarding fee collection that will hold the club in good stead for years to come.

Thank you to our sponsors who without you this club would not exist.

The team at Belle Property North Shore who have supported us for the last 17 years.

Kingston Financial who provide their boardroom for committee meetings, and all the other one percenters that allow the club to keep functioning successfully.

Landscaping by Design for their continued support again this season.

The club was led by our two amazing Vice Presidents, Andrew Bray for Seniors and Bevan Guest for Juniors. The countless hours put in by these two men enable the club to function smoothly and to let every one of our members enjoy a good season.

The club was treated again to the best grounds in Shires Cricket, and we are very lucky to have the great staff from Lane Cove Council. Thank you to Bryan, Connor and Mark for preparing great quality wickets all year round.

The club this season finished 7th nationally in the Toyota Raffle with us raising \$14,000 to be reinvested back into the club.

Notably this season was one of the best whereby the whole committee pulled together and offered greater assistance. The younger committee members really stepped up in a variety of areas, taking on many responsibilities including taking charge of the Annual Presentation Night.

Overall, the club had 260 junior members, with all 26 teams enjoying their season. The Senior club finished 9th in the Club Championship, which was down from last season, but we saw a notable improvement in 5th Grade's performance.

I look forward to another successful cricketing season for LCCC in 2026/27.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2025/2026

Membership and Participation

Senior player subscriptions increased strongly during the year. Junior subscriptions remained the Club's largest source of income, although they were lower than in the previous year. The continuing participation of junior boys and girls remains central to the Club's focus on inclusivity and future development.

Team numbers across both senior and junior cricket remained broadly consistent. Maintaining healthy player numbers will continue to be important to the Club's financial sustainability.

Financial Results

For the year ended 30 April 2026, the Club recorded a net surplus of \$21,387, compared with a deficit of \$32,017 in the previous year.

Key figures include:

- Total revenue: \$216,226 (up from \$182,371 in 2025), including \$14,442 from the Toyota Good for Cricket Raffle and \$600 in donations

Major expense areas:

- Ground hire: \$56,459 (down from \$97,773 in 2025)
- Equipment and balls: \$18,467
- NSJCA and player registration fees: \$38,329

The result represents an improvement of \$53,405 over the previous year, supported by stronger senior subscriptions, sponsorship, fundraising and lower ground-hire costs.

The Club held \$102,028 in cash and term deposits at year-end. After allowing for \$48,864 of current liabilities, principally final ground-hire charges payable, net cash was approximately \$53,164. The cash balance included \$25,899 held in the Foundation Account for infrastructure purposes.

Net assets as at 30 April 2026 were \$99,431.

Outlook and Risk Management

Looking ahead, the Club faces several significant expenses that must be carefully managed. The most material are:

- Ground hire, which remains a significant and potentially volatile cost despite being lower in 2025/26 thanks to prudent management of the ground hire system, and no finals cricket;
- Player registration and NSJCA fees, which remain substantial and are expected to increase in 2026/27; and
- The continuation and potential increase of umpire costs, which were \$12,210 in 2025/26.

These costs represent structural challenges that could place pressure on the Club's financial model.

The Committee is actively reviewing all cost drivers so that increases can be addressed through thoughtful planning, while remaining committed to keeping cricket affordable and accessible.

Despite these challenges, the Committee proposes to maintain senior registration fees at \$700 and junior registration fees at \$415 (\$377.55 if paid before 1 September 2026). These amounts exclude the Cricket Australia fee.

Maintaining healthy registration numbers and securing ongoing support from sponsors and donors will be essential in offsetting these financial headwinds.

Investment in the Future

It has been heartening to welcome new players to the sport and the Club. Investment in our junior teams cannot be overstated: they are the future of Lane Cove Cricket Club. Programs that support their growth and enjoyment will remain a key focus. A special thank you goes to the players who assisted with junior coaching throughout the year.

The Toyota Good for Cricket Raffle and the Australian Sports Foundation Lane Cove Cricket Club 2026/27 Season Campaign provide valuable ways for players, sponsors and the local community to support the Club.

Acknowledgements

On behalf of the Committee, I extend our sincere gratitude to all our sponsors, donors, volunteers, and supporters. Your continued commitment is vital to our success.

Thank you also to our captains, coaches, junior reps, parents, and players who help make Lane Cove Cricket Club a respected and thriving part of the Sydney cricket community.

Conclusion

Despite rising costs, Lane Cove Cricket Club is well positioned. With sound governance, stable participation, a strengthening Committee and dedicated community support, we remain confident in the Club's direction and long-term future.

Notes to the financial statements

30 April 2026

Note 1. Significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the officers' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The officers have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1031 'Materiality', AASB 1048 'Interpretation of Standards' and AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures', as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Sales revenue

Events, fundraising and raffles are recognised when received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received, and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Income tax

As the incorporated association is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is current when: it is expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within twelve months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is current when: it is expected to be settled in normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are always classified as non-current.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash, and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

Trade and other receivables

Other receivables are recognised at amortised cost, less any provision for impairment.

Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant and equipment (excluding land) over their expected useful lives as follows:

Buildings	40 years
Freehold improvements	15 years
Plant and equipment	3-7 years
Motor vehicles	5-7 years
Office equipment	3-5 years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the incorporated association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Note 1. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Fair value measurement

When an asset or liability, financial or non-financial, is measured at fair value for recognition or disclosure purposes, the fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date; and assumes that the transaction will take place either: in the principal market; or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market.

Fair value is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming they act in their economic best interest. For non-financial assets, the fair value measurement is based on its highest and best use. Valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, are used, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

Independent auditor's report to the members of The Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc.

Report on the financial report

I have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc., which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2026, the statement of profit or loss for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the officers' assertion statement.

Officers' responsibility for the financial report

The officers of the Lane Cove Cricket Inc. are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Act and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The officers' responsibility also includes such internal control as the officers determine is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the officers, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In my opinion, the financial report gives a true and fair view of the financial position of the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc. as at 30 April 2026, and its financial performance for the year then ended.

Basis of accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Lane Cove Cricket Club Inc. to meet the requirements of the Act. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Senior Club Awards – 2025/26

John Dettman Trophy – Ravi Ravi

The John Dettman Trophy is awarded to the Senior Club's Best and Fairest player. First Grade Report – 2025/26

First Grade went into the 2025/26 season full of confidence, coming off the back of our maiden one day premiership and semi-final finish last season. The boys were keen to go back to back in the one dayers and get into an elusive grand final for the overall competition. We managed to keep the bulk of players from this year together, replacing our overseas players with some promising recruits and adding ex First Grade captain Greg Hunt back in the fold.

Unluckily, we had the bye round 1 and went into our first game undercooked. After getting a touch up there against Burwood, we had some fortunate wins against Georges River and Warringah before starting to play some better cricket beating Pennant Hills and Auburn convincingly. We were undone in another one dayer before finally getting onboard in the one day comp with a very comprehensive win against Epping. Unfortunately, another disappointing one dayer against Lindfield and then a two day game against third last SDs, which was turned into a one day game due to heat, only to be washed out upon arrival the week after. We finished the regular season with 2 big wins against Strathfield and North West before sneaking over the line against Roseville in a rain affected game in which we were desperate for an outright win.

We finished the season in 4th but in one of the crazier tables in memory, there was only 3 points between 1st and 6th. We won every two day game (one washout) but unfortunately went 1 from 4 in our one dayers which was very disappointing given the success from the season before. Still this two day form gave us confidence going out to North West Sydney for a quarter final, our 7th in 7 seasons.

Unfortunately, with rain around and on a beautiful deck at Kanebridge Oval we were always going to be up against it. Losing the toss and bowling first, we started beautifully with the ball. Despite this, we couldn't quite match it in the field, dropping a couple of chances. Although we had them 2/18 a lot of balls had been soaked up and I wished we had had more of a look at their middle order with the new ball when conditions favoured us. The deck had really flattened out by this stage, and they went on to have a 99 run partnership and more importantly, both batsmen chewed up 150 balls each. To our credit, we kept chipping away and at no point did we give up or drop our heads. We had them 8 down when the rain came on day 1. Unluckily for us, one of the other games had not gone our way so we knew we had to turn it around the next day for us to progress.

One wicket came early, but the 10th was more elusive, and we lost a lot of valuable time. We finally managed to bowl them out for 240 at the 101 over mark. Shout out to Usama Saddiq who was the pick of our bowlers, bowling beautifully for his 4 fa. Ravi Ravi also put in an incredible effort bowling 31 overs and was unlucky not to get more than the 3 wickets he earned.

The weather apps had the rain coming within a couple of hours, so we knew we had to go quickly if we were going to get close. Still on a good batting wicket, there was a glimmer of hope. We got off to a flyer with the juxtaposed pair of Julian Scott and Greg Hunt motoring along. Greg got out at an inopportune time just as we looked as though we were going to kick into another gear. Disappointingly, our middle order faltered, and we really struggled to score from their spin. Carson Forrest was a bright spark finishing 35 not out. As the rain started to come down, we held on for a draw finishing 9/154.

A heartbreaking finish to our season. I'm still convinced we could have made a real go of it if there was less rain around. I would back us every day of the week to go at 3 an over for 80 overs on that pitch. But this is the risk you run by finishing in the bottom half of the top 6. What could have been if we had managed to win one of those one day games and finished top of the table or didn't get rained out against SDs who everyone else were beating outright. We had the team to win it which was proven by the fact we were undefeated in two dayers across the season (the only team to do this) and also having beat eventual champions Warringah in the regular season. Ultimately, we just couldn't adapt in the one dayers. I'm still incredibly proud of our efforts throughout the season. We were a frightfully good and well balanced two day side, went undefeated at home and had some moments I'll hold onto forever.

Thank you to all who made the season possible. Particularly the committee who volunteer so much time and effort. I'd also like to mention the younger guys coming through the club who have made such a big difference in the feeling around the group. It is great to see these guys develop and put their hands up to help the club. I'd like to give a special mention to Ravi Ravi for making the Shires Team of the Year and for the incredible season he had. It is a pleasure to watch him go to work. I'd also like to call out Mitch Cross who put a crazy amount into this season and was such a big help personally to me in managing 1s.

We have a great club with incredible people involved and a special culture and atmosphere that is a privilege to be a part of, as well as having the honor of captaining First Grade. Hopefully we can go a couple of steps better in 1s next year and have some more success throughout the other grades.

Second Grade Report – 2025/26

We started off the season with largely the same team as last year hence hopes were high, as were expectations for another strong performance in 2nd grade this year. Game 1 was a one dayer against Burwood, the team we bowed out to in finals last season. Having put up a total of 173 in 39 overs, we chased the target with ease finishing 3 down with 6 overs to spare bringing in the first win of the season and a big win against the former premiers and a whole lot of hope for the season ahead.

We followed this up with our first 2 dayer away vs Georges River. This was to be the first of many strong batting performances as a team posting a formidable total of 297 on day 1 with contributions all round, in particular a late flurry of 82 off 78 balls by Carson Forrest coming in at number 8. We backed this up with a strong bowling effort on Day 2 which went down to the wire and took the last 15 minutes of the day to seal the win. Joe Camarsh with a well-deserved 5 wicket bag and some incredibly hostile bowling from Ben Greaves to seal the win.

The next game was always going to be tough, playing Warringah away from home. Once again, the batsmen showed up and amassing a total of 263 with contributions all round, in particular Stephen Matheson (64) and Harvey King (46). A strong bowling effort wasn't enough to secure the win with the game going down to the last over of the day with Warringah winning by 3 wickets. A strong performance by Lane Cove and we knew the standard of the best team in the competition.

We needed to bounce back and had the perfect opportunity against a weaker side in Pennant Hills at home. We batted first and put up our biggest total of the season at 305 for 7 declared, once again with a strong performances all round from Ryan Devine (63), Zeus Irani (51) and Joseph Camarsh (79 not out from 43 delivers with five 6s and nine 4s). Joseph backed this up with his bowling picking up 4 wickets for 29 off 12 overs as well as a super spell from Layton Gray of 6 overs for 6 runs and 3 wickets. We rolled Pennant Hills for 134 and put them back in to bat, however a rain impacted afternoon meant we couldn't secure the 10 points. We settled for 6.

Our next opponent was Auburn away. We won the toss and chose to bat, and the confidence in our batting was warranted. We declared at 6 for 278 with Harvey King (50) and Sam Davis (50) as well as Ryan Devine (69) scoring the bulk of the runs. Day 2 was an absolute flat track, and Auburn took advantage of this by batting long spells without scoring which made hard work for our bowlers. Steve Lewis picked up 3 wickets; however, we couldn't close out the game with Auburn finishing 8 for 168 leaving both sides with a draw and zero points. This would come hurt us later on in the season.

We played Balmain next at home with a growing desire to secure the win post a disappointing draw. Ben Greaves (3 wickets) and Lachy Shaw (3 wickets) set the tone early with the opening spell having Balmain at 7 for 58 in a one dayer. A small resurgence saw them finish their innings at 141 runs in 41 overs. Our batting came good again, and we chased down the runs with 6 wickets in hand with Oliver Meichan (38 not out) and Joshua Kingston (31 not out) closing out the game to secure the bonus point win.

Brimming with confidence again, we played 2nd on the table, Epping away in a one dayer. A phenomenal opening spell from Ben Greaves had Epping on the ropes at 3 for 21 however

the game got away from us with a strong partnership in the middle and Epping completing their innings for 243 runs. Joe Camarsh also picked up 4 wickets from his 10 overs for 63 runs. Although we started strong with the bat with Harvey King (58) and Micah Nassif (38), we couldn't sustain the pressure and fell to our 2nd defeat of the season closing our innings at 162 runs.

We needed to bounce back in the next one dayer at home vs Lindfield. However, this wasn't to be our day, in fact it was our worst effort for the season. We managed 156 runs with strong contributions from Julian Scott (47) and Ryan Devine (40) however the rest of the batsmen failed. Our bowling effort was even worse, with no major contributions and Lindfield securing the bonus point win with 6 wickets in hand.

We needed a strong come back and that came in the form of a solid performance against Strathfield away. Normality resumed with our batsmen putting up a strong total of 242 with a brilliant 87 from Ryan Devine and 42 runs from Joshua Kingston. Lachy Shaw stepped back to allow Angus to open the bowling which was the right decision as he put together his best bowling performance of the season with figures of 7.1 overs, 6 wickets for 17 runs. We rolled through the opposition closing out their innings at 130 runs and going in for the outright. We nearly got there, getting to end of play with Strathfield 7 wickets down. A 10 point game would have been handy, but we celebrated the win and return to form.

With two games remaining in the regular season, the equation was simple at this point if we had any intentions of playing finals cricket – we needed 2 wins from our next 2 games or one at minimum plus a few results to go our way. The lads trained hard and the youngish squad of mostly under 24s were up for the fight and revving to go. First up was North West away. We batted first and started strong however finished our innings on 178 with contributions from Harvey King (46) and Joseph Camarsh (38). We needed an exceptional bowling performance to close out the game against the team coming first on the ladder on their home turf and that is exactly what we delivered. Step up Angus Mackay with a spell of 20.1 overs with 9 maidens and 4 wickets for 15 runs along with Charlie Hipkin picking up 3 wickets and well as Lachy Shaw. We rolled the opposition for 98 runs and had our best win of the season by far.

Our final game of the season was against the new top ladder leaders in Roseville at home. Bowling first, once again Ben Greaves stepped up and put in a shift picking up 4 wickets in 19 overs for 47 runs and although we had them 6 down for under 50, lack of concentration and poor decision making allowed Roseville to get to 219 runs. Our batting effort saw an early collapse with the only notable effort from Zeus Irani (48). We were all out for 133, however results went our way which meant we finished 6th on the ladder and once against secured our spot in finals cricket.

The set up for finals cricket was against Roseville back to back at their home ground. Having only recently lost to them, we knew exactly what to expect and prepared accordingly. Winning the toss, we bowled first and put Roseville under sustained periods of pressure. Contributions from Steve Lewis (3 wickets) and Joseph Camarsh (3 wickets) and a very good fielding performance had Roseville all out for 153. We came out with a lot of confidence knowing this was a small but tricky total to chase, however we couldn't hold our composure and lost early wickets as well as wickets in clumps. An outstanding batting effort from Joshua Kingston (53 runs) was the only real resistance which saw us miss out on chasing

down the total by 15 runs. We put Roseville back in to bat however a rain affected day saw us shake hands at 3 for 42.

A disappointing end to our finals journey, however I could not be disappointed with the effort and fight shown by our playing group to make it into finals cricket once again this year and represent the club with pride. All in all, it was a fantastic season and thoroughly enjoyable for all those involved as evidenced by our mandatory fines sessions post-game which wasn't missed once and generally had 100% player attendance. I'm incredibly proud of what we achieved on the field as well as the culture built off it. I cannot wait to have another crack at it with this young group of lads next season.

Third Grade Report – 2025/26

The season concluded with the side finishing 12th of 13 teams, recording 3 wins and 8 losses from 12 matches, accumulating 18 points with a net run rate of -0.444.

While the final ladder position is not reflective of the standard to which the group aspires, the season represented meaningful development across the playing group, with several individuals producing performances of genuine quality and a team culture that remained competitive and committed throughout.

It is worth highlighting that four of the eight losses were by a margin of one wicket or 26 runs or fewer, indicating a highly competitive group that was frequently in contention deep into games.

The batting unit demonstrated consistent output across the season with two players surpassing 300 runs for the campaign.

Tom Sidgreaves recorded the highest batting average among regular contributors at 43.43, while Thanush Lokray led the side in aggregate runs. Both players provided the top order with stability and consistency throughout the season.

The bowling attack was led admirably by two frontline wicket takers who shared 43 wickets between them across the season.

Janath Kasthuriarachchi led all bowlers with 22 wickets at an average of 14.18, representing an outstanding individual campaign. Charlie Hipkin recorded the best bowling average of any regular bowler at 14.22 across 9 wickets, demonstrating exceptional economy and control.

Tiger Khunmuang led the side in catches with 4 dismissals, reflecting a strong season in the field. Sai Emula contributed 2 catches and 1 stumping in the keeping role.

The playing group demonstrated commendable resilience throughout the season. On multiple occasions the side competed deep into matches against higher-placed opposition, with several results decided by the finest of margins. The collective commitment to the team's playing standards and culture remained strong throughout the campaign.

The bowling attack, led by Janath Kasthuriarachchi and Raja Islam, provided the side with consistent wicket-taking ability and was the primary driver of the team's competitive performances. The contribution of Ned Arnold as a third frontline option further strengthened the attack and was a positive development for the group.

With respect to batting, the emergence of Thanush Lokray as a consistent top-order contributor — particularly given his age and experience — is a significant development for the club. Tom Sidgreaves provided the batting unit with its most reliable anchor, and his average of 43.43 is a standard that reflects genuine quality at this level.

The side's net run rate of -0.444 and ladder position of 12th indicate that while individual performances were frequently of merit, the collective batting and bowling unit did not consistently perform in tandem. The conversion of close matches — four of which were lost

by margins of one wicket or fewer than 30 runs — represents the primary area for improvement heading into the 2026/27 season.

Fielding standards, while improving across the season, remain an area where the group has identifiable room for growth. A structured approach to fielding in pre-season preparation is recommended.

The following players are identified as having demonstrated significant development or potential warranting committee attention heading into the 2026/27 season:

Thanush Lokray — consistent top-order batting output at a junior age level; strong future prospect for higher grade consideration

Janath Kasthuriarachchi — leading wicket taker of the side; capable of performing at a higher grade

Tom Sidgreaves — highest batting average among regular contributors; a reliable and technically sound batter

The following things are recommended for the 2026/27 season:

1. Pre-season fielding programme — A structured fielding programme prior to the commencement of the season is recommended to address the side's net run rate and conversion of close matches.
2. Playing group retention — It is the captain's strong recommendation that the core playing group be retained and supported ahead of the 2026/27 season. The group has developed cohesion and a competitive identity that represents a foundation for improvement.
3. Grade promotion consideration — Janath Kasthuriarachchi and Thanush Lokray are identified as players whose performances warrant consideration for higher grade opportunities in the forthcoming season.
4. Junior pathway — Thanush Lokray's emergence as a consistent performer at senior level presents an opportunity for the club to highlight the strength of its junior to senior pathway.

The 2025/26 season, while not meeting the on-field aspirations of the playing group, represented a season of genuine effort, individual development, and competitive intent. The foundations are in place for a stronger campaign in 2026/27, and I look forward to the opportunity to lead this group again with that objective firmly in mind.
